COUNTY COUNCILLOR DAVID O'TOOLE

The last few months have been extremely busy at County Hall. After months of negotiations together with the two unitarizes Blackpool and Blackburn with Darwen we have achieved what we believe to be the best solution going forward for the residents of Lancashire. We now have a combined Lancashire wide devolved unitary authority as opposed to an elected Mayor which would have cost hundreds of thousands and would have taken local decision making away from your local elected representatives.

It has also been that time of year when the council tax for 2025-2026 is agreed. Very soon we will all receive our new council tax bills. We have kept the increase to a minimum even though we have seen massive increases in costs not least the increase in national insurance on our employees and the increase which we must pay in local government salaries.

Lancashire County Council pay millions each year for adult social care for care homes also millions for education plus the increasing costs for SEND children (special educational needs). We have put an extra 10 million in to improving our roads. Unlike many county councils we can do this because we have been prudent and built up our reserves.

The thing I get more emails and calls about are Potholes. As we all know, since last September we have had unprecedented rainfall. You cannot fill wet potholes. We are undertaking a massive tree planting program across the county; I have already seen new trees planted in my very large division including several in my own area.

Spring is on the way, and I am very happy to see an abundance of Snowdrops, Crocus and Daffodils in my own garden.

On the 1st of May 2025, the elections will be held for all 84 County Councillors. I was first elected by you onto the County Council in 2000 after serving on West Lancashire Borough Council since 1975. After serving the residents for fifty years I feel it's time to step aside. I won't be standing for election on the 1st of May. I want to thank your parish chairman for all the support he has given to me during his chairmanship, and also the members of your very active Parish Council.

I wish you all well for the future.

THE RECTOR SUSAN WRITES

Here we are again at that beautiful time of year, when we can sense new life emerging and the longer, brighter days encourage us to look up and out. The work that has been done by the 'butterflies and bees brigade' and 'proud and tidy teams' are clear for all to see. Yet, at the moment, the wider world seems a harsh and unforgiving place.

Some of you reading this will be able to remember the Second World War. Sadly, 80 years on, we see conflict and violence enacted in more parts of the world than ever. The First World War was supposed to be 'the war to end all wars', and in the aftermath of the Second World War, the nations came together to write a body of International Law that would protect human rights, protect civilians caught in armed conflict, and ensure that genocide could not happen again: we are probably all left wondering what went wrong? There are no easy answers, but part of our response should be to intentionally remember and, in doing do so, bring the past into the present; and where we can, bring hope and reconciliation. It's something we can all choose to do and its importance in building community cannot be over emphasised.

In bringing the past into the present we need to take care. In a context where many people are traumatized and angry we need to speak gently. We need to try to build each other up, as is happening with Southport after the tragic events of last summer, and in smaller ways in our own community such as the school visits to the village hall to join the coffee mornings and all the events the village put on over the year.

Building a more Christ-like world means recognizing our common humanity and accepting that none of us is perfect or has all the answers. In standing with Jesus, the victim of appalling violence, we also stand with him in the resurrection, the total antithesis of destruction and death.

It is an amazing if profoundly disturbing way to try and live. Why not join us at one of our church services over the coming month and take time to ponder what it would mean for you, your family and our communities to work towards such a Christ-like world.
